AHRC: HERITAGE FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES, KEY PROGRAMMES AND ACTIVITIES

Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC) is part of UK Research and Innovation, a new body that works in partnership with universities, research organisations, businesses, charities, and government to create the best possible environment for research and innovation to flourish. Operating across the whole of the UK with a combined budget of more than £6 billion, UK Research and Innovation brings together the seven Research Councils, Innovate UK and a new organisation, Research England. It is principally funded from the Government's Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS). Over the past few years AHRC has built upon its previous investments and enhanced its work in heritage through partnerships with other agencies, targeted funding calls and collaborations both in the UK and internationally. This short presentation will provide an overview of current heritage funding opportunities and outline key programmes and activities.

Jamie is an International Partnerships and Engagement Manager at the Arts and Humanities Research Council. From the age of 17, Jamie has been a volunteer with the Llyn Maritime museum in North West Wales, later becoming a committee member and trustee and helped to reopen the museum in 2014.
