## LOCAL, NATIONAL AND GLOBAL: Heritage funding workshop

This workshop aims to provide an overview of the heritage funding opportunities available from the National Lottery Heritage Fund and the Arts and Humanities Research Council. The workshop will include presentations by Stephen Barlow (Head of Engagement for National Lottery Heritage Fund Wales) and Dr Jamie Davies (International Partnerships and Engagement Manager for the Arts and Humanities Research Council and committee member for the National Lottery Heritage Fund Wales).

Workshop participants will be asked to reflect on their experience of applications to these funders, consider examples of best practice digital heritage projects from the funders and ask questions about opportunities and decision-making to the funders and to a decision maker.

### Biography

Starting his career at the then Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) many years ago, Stephen has considerable experience of grants administration, supporting project development and making a case for funding. In his current role as Head of Engagement for the National Lottery Heritage Fund in Wales, he leads a team that provides support to applicants in developing projects and applying for funding and manages stakeholder relationships and external communications.

Jamie is an International Partnerships and Engagement Manager at the Arts and Humanities Research Council. From the age of 17, Jamie has been a volunteer with the Llyn Maritime museum in North West Wales, later becoming a committee member and trustee and helped to reopen the museum in 2014. In addition he is a committee member of National Heritage Lottery Fund in Wales and trustee of Europa Nostra UK. Between 2016-2018 he was a teaching fellow in cultural heritage at the Ironbridge International Institute for cultural heritage, University of Birmingham. Jamie holds an Archaeology BA and an International Cultural Heritage Management Master's from Durham University and Doctorate from the Ironbridge Institute on Education at World Heritage Sites.
